President Gary Stroede called the meeting to order at 1:05 p.m. in Packy's at Hope Hotel, Fairborn.

Recording Secretary Sue Stacy read the minutes from the May 21, 2016 meeting. There were no changes or corrections and the minutes were accepted as read.

Corresponding Secretary Pam Williams reported she has finished the new rosters and handed them out. If there are corrections or address changes, Pam will provide stickers with the new information as she gets it. As far as T-shirts for Rotating, Pam said she has gotten a price of \$13 each with several different colors from an online company. She sent around a sheet with photos of the colors and asked everyone to indicate which color(s) they would like and in what size.

It was announced we are looking for a location to make new doormats. As soon as one is found, it will be announced.

Sunshine Chair Susan Jackson said she had sent out two cards this past month - one to Brad Hawley who had been in the hospital, and one to Laura Zimmerman, the daughter of long-time Scottie person Evelyn Kirk who passed away.

Rescue Coordinator Cheryl Bates said she had picked up Kipper and taken him home with her. She has him evaluated by a Canine Behaviorist who said Kipper's main problem was lack of socialization which makes him fearful. Thanks to Denyse Marshall, Kipper has now found a forever home with Gary and Peggy Moore from Cincinnati who also adopted the puppy Cheryl had. Cheryl will be picking up a 5 year-old Scottie from Marion. She is also working with others to shut down the West Virginia puppy mill.

Show Chair Sue Stacy reported that she had been contacting people to fill committee chair positions and had most of them taken care of. Barb Zink will be returning as coordinator of our Sanctioned "B" Puppy Match, and Marcia Dawson has agreed to take over as Trophy Chair. Sue thanked Pam Williams for the job she did while serving as Trophy Chair. Marcia Harbison will continue as Boutique Chair but will be assisted by Marcie Kelsay. Sue did ask that any donations to boutique this year be something people would really want to buy, and that there will be no more IOUs. You can pick your items and ask that they be held until you come back

with the money to pay for them, but you cannot take and pay later. Marcia said she is going to work on "Welcome Bags" for hotel guests as we've had in the past.

Pam explained the Top 20 which will take place on Friday night of our show weekend and provided a schedule of events. During the afternoon, STCA will hold several workshops of interest to visitors. These will be followed by Hospitality, the Sanctioned "B" puppy match, and then the Top 20. Twenty of the top dogs in the nation are invited to participate in a special show. It is a formal event with evening gowns and tuxedos and each dog is judged by three different judges whose scores are then combined to determine a winner. This is an opportunity for people to see the top Scottish Terriers in the U.S.

Angie said she has received all the squares for the quilt and it is now being assembled by Karen Unfried. Valerie Underwood said she had spoken to Karen and reports the quilt will be done by July 15<sup>th</sup> and ready to send for the final quilting.

Marcia Dawson presented an update on the Bladder Cancer study at Purdue University. There has been an increase in early detection through twice yearly checking of urine. A genetic mutation has been found that indicates the possibility of finding cancer in 85% of the cases checked. The test will be available to veterinarians with a quick turn-around time. For breeders, the test will be available on the AKC sales page at a discount. This offers the best chance of getting ahead of the disease.

Our next get-together will be at the Winery in Morrow the first Sunday in August.

In September, we will again have our picnic at Fairborn Park. Valerie Underwood will make arrangements.

Cliff Norman moved and Kim Stroede seconded a motion for adjournment. The motion passed and the meeting was adjourned at 2:03 p.m.
