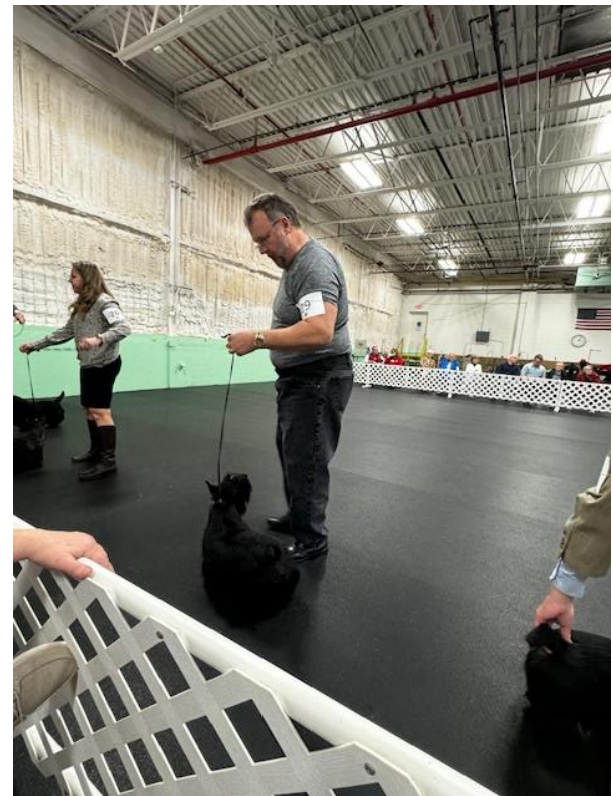
As the Show Chair for the Saturday annual specialty, I also thank all of the members that donated their time and money that contributed to the success of the weekend.

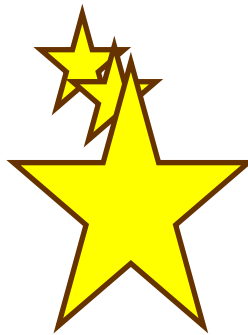

Stuka Day

STCGD members Lisa Inman Lee and Geiger Lee will be hosting a Scottie meetup on the grounds of the Museum of the US Airforce in Dayton on May 18, 2024, from noon to 4 p.m. There is no cost to attend this event. Attendees do not have to be club members. This is open to all Scottie families, purebred or "blended." We expect to have at least 40 Scotties in attendance.

The event is in honor of "Stuka," the Scottish Terrier mascot of the famed WWII B-17 bomber, the Memphis Belle, and her owner, pilot James Verinis. The Memphis Belle is on permanent display in the Museum.

Planned activities include:

- Presentations about Stuka and Captain Verinis, the life of a B-17 crew member, the Memphis Belle's restoration and war bond tour.
- An update regarding health research for Scotties and an available, complimentary STCA/HTF DNA Bank sampling by an onsite veterinarian for the preservation of Scottie DNA, to monitor genetic and genomic data of the breed, and to provide DNA samples for future research and DNA testing to benefit all Scotties.
- A Scottie parade led by a bagpiper.
- A special accommodation by the museum to allow the Scotties and their families to briefly enter the Museum after it closes at 5 p.m. for a group photo next to the Memphis Belle in the Museum.

Special guests will include:

- The Cocker family whose Scottie "Bentley" portrayed Stuka for the 2018 weeklong unveiling of the restored Belle. They are bringing his custom-made uniform made for him by the restoration team modeled after the actual uniform worn originally by Stuka during his tours.
- "Monty The Therapy Dog" and owners Tracy and Randy Krapf. Monty has earned many AKC titles in performance events and therapy work.
- YouTube influencer and Ohio WWII historian John Heffner.

There will be giveaways including autographed copies of books, a custom-made kilt for a Scottie in attendance by Louisa of Cozy Costs for Pets in South Africa and other things as well.
