Health Trust Fund of the STCA DNA Bank Blood Draw

When: Saturday, Aug. 24, 2024

Time: 11 a.m. to 3 p.m. - Please print out forms, one per dog, and have them filled out prior to the DNA draw. There will be a veterinarian and veterinary tech there to do the draws. We will have a gift for your pup.

Where: Dayton Dog Training Club, 3046 E. River Rd, Moraine, OH, in conjunction with the STCGD Family Fun Show (kitchen area).

Who will draw the blood? Dr. Gary Smith of PetCare Animal Hospital, Loveland, Ohio. Dr. Smith will have a veterinary technician assist him.

Why not just do a cheek swab for the DNA sample? The DNA bank is storing the highest quality and quantity of DNA from all Scotties for future research. The best quality and quantity of Scottie DNA is derived from a blood sample, not the cheek swab. The amount of blood needed is very small, no more than half of a teaspoon.

What does it cost? There is no charge. The Health Trust Fund of the STCA is paying all expenses.

Do I have to pre-register? It is helpful to submit your name, email and number of Scotties attending so we can be prepared with materials and paperwork for everyone. But pre-registration is not necessary, and all Scotties are welcomed to this event.

What do I need to bring? Please bring your Scottie's AKC number, sire and dam's names if known, date of birth, color, and microchip number if your Scottie is chipped. And don't forget your Scotties!

What about paperwork? We will help you with the necessary forms and materials when you arrive. If you want to save time, you can fill out the two forms ahead of time and bring them with you. Click [here](#) to view and download the forms.

Dr. Griffin, DVM will do the ultrasounds as well as fill out the screening report below with her findings for all Scottie owners to take to their own vets for any follow-up required.

Requirements for the scan: Scotties must be five years of age or older and never diagnosed with bladder cancer. Cost is \$40 total per dog when above criteria are met. The remainder of the cost is covered by our grant received from the STCA Health Trust Fund.

Stuka Day 2024

Scottie lovers gathered on May 18 in Dayton, Ohio for Stuka Day 2024. The event was held on the grounds of the US Air Force Museum, home to the legendary WWII B-17 Bomber "The Memphis Belle," in recognition of the Scottish Terrier "Stuka." Purchased in England during the war by Captain James Verinis, "Stuka" was the famous crew's mascot.

Hosted by STCGD members Geiger and Lisa Lee, and supported by several volunteers from the club, Stuka Day 2024 was attended by 44 Scotties and families from six states. Attendees were greeted at the VIP hospitality tent by a nine-foot-tall inflatable Scottie and a bagpiper playing the bagpipes, who later led a Scottie parade around the Museum. The day's events included multiple presentations, including those about "Stuka" and the restoration of the Memphis Belle.

In 2018, local resident Brian Cocker brought his Scottie "Bentley" to the rollout ceremony of the Bomber's restoration. For the big event, the restoration team made a uniform identical to the one "Stuka" wore during the 1943 War Bond Tour, and for Stuka Day 2024, the Air Force Museum allowed the uniform to be worn by another Scottie owned by Mr. Cocker. Mr. Cocker spoke fondly of his experience at the rollout ceremony and shared video clips of Bentley's ride in the nose of a B-17.

Longtime Scottie owner Diane Kendig, a writer and teacher, talked about her father's time as a tail gunner in a B-17. She also touchingly shared her father's story about how, at the end of the war, his commanders had the crews visit the Nazi concentration camps so they could "understand what they had been fighting for."

Another presenter, Ohio historian John Heffner touched on how one stop in Cleveland during the war bond tour was particularly noteworthy as it brought an end to the relationship of the captain of "The Belle" and the real "Memphis Belle," who was the inspiration for the plane's name.

Three veterinary technicians were on hand to collect blood samples for the STCA HTF DNA Blood Bank, and other presentations included the discussion of cancer in Scotties, what is involved when someone is looking to adopt from the rescue program, and the fight against puppy mills. A representative from the awareness group "Bailing Out Benji" explained how some puppy mills are masquerading as rescue organizations and also provided information on how to identify a reputable breeder. Lee Ann Whaley and Tracy Krapf provided information about the many activities that Scottie owners can do through AKC beyond the show ring.

All attendees received keepsake "Stuka Day 2024" metal dog tags, and there were drawings for fun prizes, including a hand-made custom kilt donated by Cozy Coats for Pets from South Africa. At the end of the day, the museum graciously facilitated a group photo at the base of the Memphis Belle. It was a fabulous ending to a truly wonderful event.
