Congratulations to Marcia Harbison, who was awarded the Good Sportsmanship Award. She has given so much to the club. Thank you, Marcia.

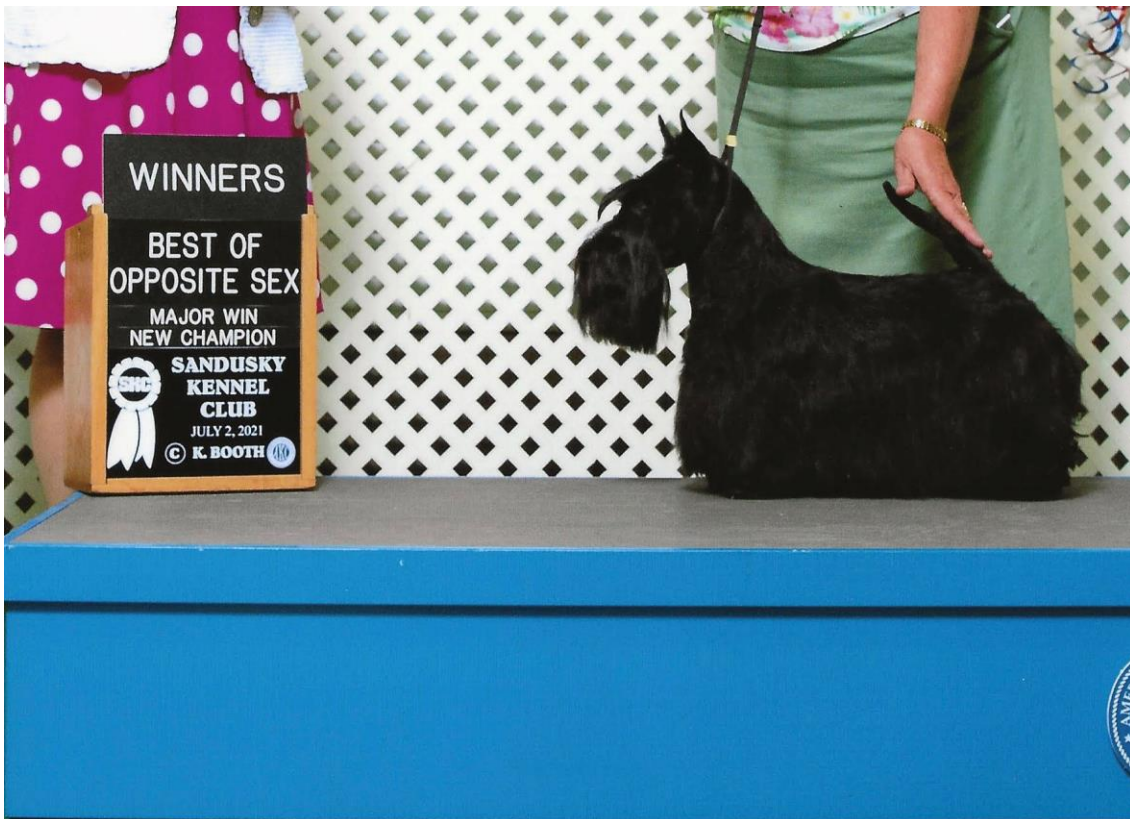

Rescue Report And the Circle goes 'Round...

A month ago, the need for rescue efforts started to grow again, so a recruitment call was announced on our Rescue Facebook page for foster families. We have been pleased by the response and now have a roster of helpers should we be inundated with Scotties. Of course, sometime there are failures. (See below)

Doughal - Van and Margie Jones' Scottie has been adopted by his foster mom, Deny Marshall. She had grown to love him (and vice versa) and after the recent death of her Sheltie, Jett, had an empty space in her home and heart. A Scottie is the cure for that!

Kurtsie - Kurtsie's owner died July 31 and his family decided that they couldn't keep her. Deny and I made a road trip to the Toledo area one Sunday and brought her back to Dayton to the care of a family who had recently signed up to foster rescue Scotties. The family has had her for three weeks, working to correct her bad habits (nothing serious; her late owner had been a bit over-indulgent) and having fallen in love with her, asked to adopt her. Another successful placement and another foster failure! (see above).

Sammie - In 2013, STCGD placed the infamous Sammie, who holds second place in adventurous road trips (ask me about that sometime). Sammie was well loved by his new mom, Cathy. Unfortunately, both Cathy's and Sammie's health declined with age. Cathy passed away in her home in early August. She and Sammie were found two days after last contact by Cathy's friends. Her friends knew where Sammie had come from and contacted us to find him a new home for the rest of his life. We picked him up on a Sunday afternoon and he came home with Cheryl. He seemed lethargic which we attributed to the stress and rapid change in his life over the course of four days. By Sunday evening he began having seizures and refusing food and water. He was taken to Medvet Dayton where he did not respond to basic treatment. I had been given year old vet records that indicated he could have an autoimmune disease for which he had not been treated, with a 50% survival rate after the first year. I made the painful decision to let him go join Cathy. Sammie was with me when he went to Cathy eight years ago: I was with him when he began his journey to the Rainbow Bridge, reminding him that he was a good boy.



Chuckie – As of this writing, we have not yet picked up Chuckie. His humans are moving into assisted living and their daughter wants to give them until the move is completed to stay together. Details to follow in the next newsletter
